Did you know that in the year 2000, Western Philatelic Library was designated as a one of our nation's treasures?

Save America's Treasures was a United States Federal Government Initiative to preserve and protect historic buildings, arts and published works.

It was a public-private partnership between the United State National Park Service and the National Trust for Historic Preservation.

The National Endowment for the Arts Heritage Preservation and the National Park Foundation were also allied.



The Library is located at 3004 Spring Street

Save America's Treasures was established in February of 1998.

Instrumental in its founding was First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton who served as Honorary Chair and who signed the certificate that was presented to Western Philatelic Library.

Sadly, because of budget woes at the Federal Government, both Save America's Treasures and the Preserve America grant programs were eliminated in 2010.

But the Western Philatelic Library remains as one of America's Treasures, a Treasure that we are working to preserve and that we are lucky to have.

We are sad to note that our dear friend and Editor of *The Bay Phil*, Richard M. Hanchett, passed away on February 2,



SUMMARY OF BOARD ACTIONS JANUARY TO JUNE 2017

January 21, 2017:

Contributions were received from 39 Library Members as a

Board Secretary Nestor Nunez has filed the past Federal Tax Returns together with forms to regain the 501(c)3 non-profit status.

IRS Required Governance Notebooks have been set up at the Library.

March 18, 2017:

unbudgeted income item of \$25,946.45 under "Auctions – Other" for proceeds of a collection donated by Roger Skinner.

Stuart Leven announced the bulk sale of 124 bound periodical volumes from a recent 25 carton donation.

Bob Gordon, the new Editor of the *Bay Phil*, introduced himself to the Board and presented a mock-up of a suggested new layout for the quarterly 12-page publication. The new target dates will be the first of January, April, July, and October each year.

Board Secretary Nestor Nunez reported that IRS Form 1023 was mailed on July 10.

August 19, 2017:

Editor Bob Gordon presented a draft of the next issue of the *Bay Phil* for comments, corrections, and suggestions from the Board. The target date for publication of the next issue is now September 1st. Bob will work with Webmaster Dave Moore to get the *Bay Phil* on the Friends of the Western Philatelic Library Website.







Catalogue and Handbook of Tattersall's Covers



Book Review

Australians have always been a nation of inveterate gamblers, but the various State governments were mostly opposed in principle, so that undercover arrangements were implemented to meet the needs of the punters.

In 1881 George Adams, owner of Tattersall's Hotel on Pitt Street, Sydney, offered consultations on the outcome of major Australian horse racing events for the Tattersall Club that met in his hotel. Because demand to join in the lottery increased, Adams extended his lotteries to the public, and his mailing list increased rapidly. In late 1883, when lotteries and their related mail deliveries were outlawed by the New South Wales Government, Adams moved his operation to Brisbane, Queensland. The Queensland Government took similar action in 1895 and, although this was later rescinded, Adams decided to move to Hobart, Tasmania, where the government was more amenable, provided that the operation was only carried out by mail under Government supervision.

With the creation of the Commonwealth of Australia on I January 1901, the antigambling lobby succeeded in pressing the new Federal Postmaster General to announce a national postal ban on all lotteries. George Adams' response was to establish a system of accommodation addresses. After some initial setbacks, he set up a large private mail network, using friends, banks, newspapers and other business houses, plus several aliases, as undercover agents.

This book is a detailed catalogue record of these many accommodation addresses, illustrated by related covers and a background to the numerous addressees. The contents, arranged in alphabetical order, represent a wealth of study and research. They include a rarity guide; an extensive bibliography, and an index of all alias addresses known to the author. There is also a further index of street addresses, showing the agents at each location. The book is not only a useful record for postal historians, but also a remarkable insight into an aspect of Australian social history.
