### IRS reinstates Library's tax-exempt status

Donors to The Friends of Western Philatelic Library, Inc. can again receive full tax deductions

# Great news from the IRS!

The Internal Revenue Service has reinstated The Friends of the Western Philatelic Library, Inc.'s taxexempt status.

For anyone who chooses to donate to The Friends of Western Philatelic Library, this means that once again, your donation will be fully deductible.

Here's what the IRS wrote:

"We're pleased to tell you we determined you're exempt from federal tax income under Internal Revenue Code (IRC) Section 501 (c) (3).

Donors can deduct contributions they make to you under IRC Section 170. You're also qualified to receive tax deductible bequests, transfers or gifts under Section 2055, 2016, or 2522.

Based on the information you submitted in your application, we approved your request for reinstatement under Revenue Procedure 2014-11. Your effective date of exemption, as listed at the top of this letter (December 14, 2017), is retroactive to your date of revocation."

Friends of Western Philatelic Library Board Member Nestor Nunez has worked steadily and patiently to restore our status. We can't thank him enough for his perseverance.

### SUMMARY OF BOARD ACTIONS OCTOBER TO DECEMBER 2017

#### October 14, 2017:

Ed Jarvis noted that the matter of a new Treasurer has to be addressed at the December meeting as Jo Skinner is resigning that position as of December 31, 2017.

**Roy Teixeira** reported on the replacement of fences behind the library and said he has a quote of \$3,625 for the front gate. Action will be taken up at a later meeting.

The **Library** intends to continue its presence at **WESTPEX** in **2018**, but **Roger Skinner** can no longer handle the transportation of the books to the hotel. **People Ready** can be hired for this work.

Another **Open House** / **Auction** at the Library was suggested by **Ed Jarvis** for **January** or **February**.

Election of Officers will be necessary in the first six months of 2018 with a suggestion of rolling three year terms staggered over the next three years.

#### **December 9, 2017:**

**Nestor Nunez** has volunteered to take over as **Treasurer** at least until new officers are elected next year as **Jo Skinner** is resigning the Treasurer's position as of **December 31, 2017**.


Roy Teixeira has been assigned the task of picking up mail and distributing it to appropriate parties at the Library. The Sunnyvale PO Box will be renewed at the end of December to assure receipt of mail there that has not yet been address corrected.


**Richard Clever** announced that the **Library** has a current membership of 239.







On Friday evening, January 7th, a small but enthusiastic committee of "Friends" traveled to San Francisco, and the Richelieu Hotel, to present the non-award-winning S.B.P.L. promotional slide program, "The South Bay Philatelic Library, 1971," to nearly 70 members of the California Collectors' Club. President and Mrs. Frank Holly, Directors John Syracuse and Tom Pulley, and Bay Phil Editor, Bob Will, were graciously received by President Garvin Lohman and the entire membership.

President Holly presented a short five-minute speech covering the history of the S. B. P. L., and introduced the rest of our group to the membership. The slide presentation was then shown.

The result of this venture, the first of many hoped-for future visits to Bay Area stamp clubs, was a high level of enthusiasm and interest from the members. Brochures, sample S. B. P. L. Journals, and membership forms were picked up quickly from John Syracuse after his short but eloquant speech. Several ideas were discussed and exchanged, some of which will immediately be added to the growing file of things to do for the S. B. P. L.

Finally, a donation of several catalogs and stock books was received from a member who also joined the Library at the same time.

That the trip was viewed by us as a huge success can be proven by the resulting apparent interest, of the members, in the many facets of our Library. And it is hoped that by visiting other stamp clubs and civic groups, in the years to come, a high degree of involvement and interaction between philatelists will be assured and maintained. It had its beginning on January 7, 1972, at the California Collectors' Club.





### Remembering Paul Swierstra

Western Philatelic Library Member Paul Swierstra died on Thursday, November 30, 2017.

For many decades, Paul hosted Western Philatelic Library tables at area stamp shows. He sold tear-sheets and duplicate books for the Library. He also traveled hundreds of miles to pick up donations that sometimes included more than thirty boxes.

Paul belonged to the local Sequoia Stamp Club which he joined in 1977. He served as Club President longer than any other, for a total of 5 1/2

He also helped with Club membership and served as Club Archivist for over 15 years.

Born in the Netherlands, Paul was an avid Dutch collector who also enjoyed collecting "RPO" (Railway Post Office) cancels.

Another philatelic interest was his search for cancels from every post office in Paris, a collection which was close to being complete.

Paul was good natured and had a memory for what others collected.

When the Western Philatelic Library needed someone to step up, it was Paul who would fill in

He will be missed by all who knew him.



# **Upcoming events**

### **WESTPEX®** 2018 Stamp Show Call for Exhibits

The exhibitor's prospectus is now available for the fifty-eighth annual WESTPEX show April 27-29, 2018 at the San Francisco Airport Marriott Waterfront Hotel, 1800 Old Bayshore Highway, Burlingame, CA, just a mile south of the San Francisco International Airport. The exhibitor's prospectus and entry forms are available from Bill Lenarz, P.O. Box 251 Kentfield, CA 94914-0251 or at www.westpex.org.

This World Series of Philately open exhibition will feature over 300 frames of exhibits, including participation by the Women Exhibitors, the American Air Mail Society and the Rhodesian Study Circle. This is a World Series of Philately exhibition with the Grand Award winner eligible for the Annual Champion of Champions competition at the American Philatelic Society Stamp Show in August 2018.

The shows bourse includes seventy-five national and international dealers in stamps, postal history and stationery along with a four-day auction by Schuyler Rumsey Auctions of San Francisco that will fill the bourse with items for the general collector, the specialist and exhibitor.

Numerous specialty societies, clubs, and study groups will hold more than fifty meetings and seminars during the three-day event. There is a WESTPEX sponsored Youth Area with free stamps and supplies for young collectors. On Sunday April 29th a Boy Scout Merit Badge program is scheduled, which was a sell-out last year.

A pre-show event will take place on Wednesday April 25, 2018 and will feature the Collectors Club of San Francisco dinner meeting.
