Summary of Board Actions

Board Meetings of The Friends of Western Philatelic Library, Inc. are open to all.

SUMMARY OF BOARD ACTIONS MARCH 2019

MARCH 16, 2019:

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Nestor Nunez presented the Financial Statements for 2018 as well as 2019 through February 28, detailing the income and expenditures including Balance Sheets, Profit and Loss Statements, Cash Receipts (for November 2018 through February 2019), and a detailed report on the Restricted Funds for Library Safety showing sources and a breakdown of spending. Ed Jarvis moved (seconded by Richard Clever) to transfer \$1,532 in unspent restricted Building and Book Funds to the General Fund. The motion passed unanimously. Nestor mentioned that this year's 2019 WESTPEX contribution of \$5,000 has yet to be received. Other sources of **Income** will include the April Open House, WESTPEX Book Sales, Auction Sales at Filatelic Fiesta, and the monthly eBay Sales. Nestor thanked Jerry Mix for helping him to access PayPal Account funds which are now included in the assets. Ed Jarvis moved to accept the Report, seconded by Roger Skinner, and passed unanimously.

Open House and Auction: The Open House will be held on Saturday April 13, 2019 starting at 10:00 am with an Auction at 11:00 am. Ken Lewetzow and Wally Jolliff have described and listed the lots. Thanks to Wally Jolliff, the listing of Auction Items are already on the Website. The Open House will also feature a Book Sale as well as free Literature and Accessories. Ed Jarvis mentioned that he and Judy will sponsor coffee, tea, and cookies for the event. Roy Teixeira will oversee the event. Setup will begin on Friday April 12 and Roy can use volunteers. His wife Sigrid, Kristin Patterson, and Dave Moore have already offered to help.

Membership and Mailing: Richard Clever reported that there are still currently 230 members, with 10 overseas. There were some delivery issues with the current *BayPhil*.

<u>Safety Committee Report</u>: Ed Jarvis announced that the new gates have been installed for the price quoted two years ago. **Nestor Nunez** offered his thanks to **Roy Teixeira** for managing the project.

Railroad Books: Michal Turrini has offered to convey the collection of Railroad Books to the Carquinez Model Railroad Society. Ed Jarvis moved, seconded by Nestor Nunez, to donate the books. Passed without objection.

<u>General Cleanup</u>: Roy Teixeira has been taking truckloads of materials to a recycling center.

New BOD Members: Ed Jarvis suggested that each current Board Member recruit a new prospect one on one. Nestor Nunez offered to pay the Life Membership cost for one recruit who is not yet a Life Member. Ed Jarvis added he might do the same.

Book Review by Alan Warren

La Posta Publications, which publishes the United States quarterly postal history journal *La Posta*, also issued a series of eleven monographs that ended in 1995. The publisher initiated a new series in 2018 and this is the first title released.

Patricia Kaufmann's book appeared in various formats including as an article in the 2017 book, *Aspects of American Postal History*. It has now been revised and expanded in this new standalone edition. The author has conducted groundbreaking research to correct misinformation that appeared repeatedly over the years.

The focus of the monograph is revealed in its subtitle, *How Secession Occurred;*Correcting the Record. The exact dates of when each state seceded and then joined the

Confederate States of America (CSA) are now documented based on the author's examination of each state's laws and archival records.

Each state's actions are recorded in chronological order beginning with South Carolina in December 1860 and ending with Kentucky in December 1861. For each state the author summarizes the events leading to its secession and joining the Confederacy. In addition to the recognized states there are also discussions of the Indian Nations (did not "secede" but joined CSA), New Mexico Territory (never seceded and never joined CSA), and Arizona Territory (seceded and admitted to CSA). During the sequence of events the Confederate Post Office Department was established and took over postal operations in the CSA under its Postmaster General John M. Reagan.


The monograph is nicely designed and enhanced with illustrations of covers, key personnel, cartoons, printed documents and photographs. A list of over two dozen endnotes records the author's sources. Trish Kaufmann's passion for Confederate philately and postal history continues with this additional publication in her lifelong documentation of the field.
