Summary of Board Actions

THE FRIENDS OF THE WESTERN PHILATELIC LIBRARY, INC.

SUMMARY OF BOARD ACTIONS NOVEMBER 2019 and JANUARY 2020

NOVEMBER 16, 2019:

<u>Funds and Fundraising</u>: Nestor Nunez thinks that the Library needs to make a Game Plan for how to deal with the Library Building. Should the FWPL re-finance, pay down or pay off the loan which currently stands at about \$491,000? Nestor proposed that the BOD create a Committee for Long Term Finance. Ed Jarvis (Chair), David McNamee, Nestor Nunez, Steve Schumann, and Roger Skinner were named to the committee.

<u>Website</u>: Webmaster Dave Moore has resigned and a new Webmaster is needed. In the absence of a Webmaster the *Bay Phil* is not being uploaded to the Website.

Open House in 2020 - Philatelic Sale:

The date for the next **Open House** and **Sale** has been set for **Saturday April 4, 2020**.

JANUARY 11, 2020:

New Board Member: Ed Jarvis asked that Steve Schumann be made an *At Large* Director of the FWPL. Moved by Richard Clever, seconded by Roger Skinner, and passed unanimously.

Treasurer's Report: Nestor Nunez presented the Financial Statements through December 31, 2019, detailing the income and expenditures including Balance Sheets, Profit and Loss Statements, and Cash Receipts. Nestor mentioned receiving two \$1,000 contributions from members and that this year's **2020 WESTPEX** contribution of \$5,000 has not yet been received. Nestor will write "Thank You" letters for contributions on behalf of the FWPL. Other sources of **Income** for 2020 will include the April Open House and WESTPEX Book Sales. At the current "burn rate" of about \$3,500 a month, the funds now available should last to about October, **2020**. Additional funds are expected from various sources. The balance due on the Library Loan is \$489,000 at 4-1/2% interest with the note due in 2023.

Board Meetings of The Friends of Western Philatelic Library, Inc.

The Federal Form 990 is due on May 15th. Steve Schumann moved to accept the Treasurer's Report, seconded by Roger Skinner, and passed unanimously.

Funds and Fundraising: The date for the next Open House and Book Sale has been set for Saturday April 4, 2020. Viewing will start at 10:00 am with the Sale at 11:00 am. All duplicate books will be offered at 50% off marked prices. Steve Schumann noted that Philatelic Literature is currently selling at about 20% of Retail Prices. Other fundraising ideas include a "Go Fund Me" Page which Steve volunteered to explore.

Membership and Mailing: Richard Clever reported that there are currently 228 members, with 10 overseas. Richard said that he maintains the membership mailing list and sent renewal notices and donation requests. Roy Teixeira handles the mailing list for the *Bay Phil* and they coordinate any address changes.

<u>Library Cleanup</u>: Roy Teixeira continues to manage the cleanup. He has done a lot in the last six months taking countless loads to the dump and recycling.

- a. <u>Donation Policy</u>: The <u>Library</u> will accept everything (except the *American Philatelist*), but *only* philatelic material.
- b. Policy Statement for retention of duplicated copies: The Library will keep one bound (or ready for binding) copy of Journals plus 1 copy of each as backup. c. Personal items in the Library- time limit? BOD authorization to recycle: A resolution to remove personal items was passed at the November 16, 2019 BOD meeting. Roger Skinner has agreed to dispose of old electrical items stored in the area under the raised platform.
- d. Stamp sorting room for Wally Jolliff and Ken Lewetzow (area under raised platform in rear of Library): The newly cleared room will be made available for Wally and Ken to use for sorting and describing lots for the upcoming and future Sales. Moved by Roger Skinner, seconded by Roy Teixeira and passed unanimously.







Review of:

Japanese Canadians in World War II: Censored Mail from the Uprooting in British Columbia

Louis Fiset, a busy exhibitor and author, brings out this second of a proposed three-volume work on internment of noncombatants in World War II. The first one was *Detained, Interned, Incarcerated: U.S. Enemy Alien Internment Camp Mail in World War II.* He now addresses the dislocation of Japanese Canadians from British Columbia and their relocation to various camps in the interior of the province. More importantly he describes the handling and censorship of the inmates' mail.

The physical uprooting began in March 1942, and almost immediately authorities imposed civil censorship of internee mail. 22,000 Japanese Canadians residing in a 100-mile swath along the western coast of Canada were affected. They were not allowed to return to the coast until April 1949. Some of the internees were relocated to road camps in eastern Canada where they were engaged in highway improvement projects. While some of the wealthier Japanese Canadians were sent to self-supporting communities, most were involuntarily moved to housing centers.

Examples of censored mail during and after resettlement are shown with informative captions throughout the book. One table lists identification numbers of censorship examiners across Canada. Some of the detainees were relocated to prisoner-of-war camps, and correspondence includes POW postcards and letter sheets. The International Red Cross assisted in communications of detainees with relatives abroad. Censored mail to the IRC in Geneva and covers related to the diplomatic exchange ship M.S. Gripsholm are also shown.

With the outbreak of the war, native-language Japanese newspapers in Canada were shut down. The English language paper The New Canadian, became the sole voice for Japanese Canadians. Censored mail to and from the newspaper is analyzed by the author.

After the war many of the relocated detainees were encouraged to return to British Columbia, so the newspaper moved its headquarters to Toronto. Domestic mail after the war was no longer censored but letters to Japan were. A few detainees wished to return to their homeland but most were willing to leave the housing complexes and seek residence and employment in eastern Canada.

One appendix discusses censor handstamps and resealing labels. Another summarizes the efforts of the Canadian government to provide redress to Japanese Canadians during the post war years.

The layout of the book is in easy to read two-column format and covers are nicely displayed. The spiral binding allows the book to lie flat when open for ease of use. References appear at the end of each chapter, and a general bibliography provides more opportunities for background and research. An index concludes the monograph.

Fiset's book joins his growing library of important references for those seeking details on the handling of detainee mail and its censorship.


This World Series of Philately open exhibition will feature over 275 frames of exhibits, including participation by the United States Possessions Philatelic Society, the Canal Zone Study Group, the Colombia-Panama Philatelic Study Group and the American Philatelic Society—Spring Meeting. This is a World Series of Philately exhibition with the Grand Award winner eligible for the Annual Champion of Champions competition at the American Philatelic Society Stamp Show to be held in Hartford, CT in August 2020.

The shows bourse includes seventy-five (75) national and international dealers in stamps, postal history and stationery along with a four-day auction by Schuyler Rumsey Auctions of San Francisco that will fill the bourse with items for the general collector, the specialist and exhibitor.

Numerous specialty societies, clubs, and study groups will hold more than fifty meetings and seminars during the three-day event. The Royal Philatelic Society of London will be hosting a symposium on Saturday, April 25th.

There is a WESTPEX sponsored Youth Area with free stamps and supplies for young collectors.

On Sunday April 26th a Boy Scout Merit Badge program is scheduled, which was a sell-out last year.
